To be eligible to vote at the District Convention, the following is required to be on file:

- All District audits on file with State Treasurer
- District dues paid
- . List of Delegates and Alternates to the District sent to District Secretary 30 days prior to meeting

Installation Form and Delegates forms for District, Department and National Conventions are attached but fillable forms will also be sent to your President and Secretary.

VFW Auxiliary Membership Moment

How to Ensure a Membership Application is Complete



One of the most critical steps in considering a new member for the VFW Auxiliary is the careful review of the prospective member's application details by a three-member Investigating Committee appointed by the Auxiliary President (as outlined in Section 102 of the 2023 VFW Auxiliary Bylaws and Ritual).

The investigating committee cannot include the Auxiliary President or the member recruiting/recommending the applicant per section 102 of the Bylaws. It is also recommended the Auxiliary treasurer not serve on the investigating committee.

As an exclusive veterans' service organization, the VFW Auxiliary must ensure that every prospective member's eligibility has been thoroughly vetted by an Investigating Committee before any action can be taken on the application. According to Page 1 of the VFW Auxiliary Booklet of Instructions, "it is the duty of the Investigating Committee to see that the applications are filled out completely before they are presented to the body for consideration." The following fields are to be completed on each application:

All information must be completed neat and legible. Application forms dated prior to 2021 will not accepted. You should be using the most current application form.

- Signatures of the Investigating Committee (at least 2)
- Signature line following the Obligation.
 Date the application is signed

In addition to the prospective member's application, it is the responsibility of the Investigating Committee to review proof of honorable service of the eligible veteran, unless he/she is a member of the VFW Post to which the applicant is applying for membership.

Proof of the veteran's honorable service in any foreign war, insurrection or expedition (as a member of the U.S. Armed Forces) may be determined through careful examination of a Separation Document (DD214) with a VFW-authorized campaign or service medal of the United States; receipt of Hostile Fire or Imminent Danger Pay, as verified by a copy of a Leave and Earning Statement (LES) issued by the U.S. Armed Forces; or service in Korea for 30 consecutive/60 non-consecutive days after June 30, 1949.

Performance reports, travel orders, medical orders, medals reports, morning reports, assignment listings, buddy affidavits, and letters from a foreign war zone may also be reviewed if a DD214 is not available. For veterans pre-1946, a report of their discharge listing the medals and decorations that were earned is acceptable proof.

For soldiers currently on active duty, they will not have a DD214. In those cases, the appropriate orders showing overseas deployment to a qualifying area, or awarding of an authorized campaign medal, or a LES showing Hostile Fire/Imminent Danger pay will suffice to prove eligibility.

In order for the applicant to join as a Post affiliated member, the Veteran MUST be a member of the same Post the applicant is joining AND the Veteran MUST still be living. If the Veteran is deceased, they are no longer affiliated with the Post. Therefore, the applicant may not join as Post affiliated and will need to provide proof of eligibility.

Once the investigating committee has thoroughly reviewed the application to ensure it properly completed, the application should be given to the secretary to present to the membership a vote of acceptance. (Any application missing any information, including Date of birth, Veterans information, etc., should not be presented to the members until all omissions have been completed). Once the application has been voted on and accepted by the membership, it should then be given to the Auxiliary Treasurer to complete the process. A final inspection of the application for accuracy lies with the Auxiliary Treasurer. The application should not be sent to the Department Treasurer if any information is missing from the application.

The application, along with the proper amount of dues, is then submitted to the Department treasurer for processing. If the applicant is an annual member, the current amount to submit with the application is \$11. If the applicant is joining as a Life member, you mut submit the full amount of the Life dues, unless the dues are being paid by credit card. Any application, especially those being paid with credit card, that was signed more than 3 months prior to the application being submitted to the Department for processing, will be returned. National considers these a "dead signature" and an updated application with a new signature is require. (Please remember that the applicant IS NOT a member of the Auxiliary, and cannot be elected into an office until the application has been processed and a membership number has been assigned to the applicant.)

Please keep in mind the Department Treasurer is not permitted to alter an application in any way. Applications missing information will be returned to the Auxiliary to complete. If multiple applications are sent with one check and there is an error on one application, all the applications will be returned.

Old Testament – For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD. And the blood shall be to you for a token upon the houses where ye are: and when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and the plague shall not be upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt. Exodus 12:12-13

New Testament – For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; and that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures. 1 Corinthians 15: 3-4

In the Jewish and Christian faith, two major events are loosely aligned, Passover and Easter.



Passover is the major Jewish spring festival which commemorates the liberation of the Israelites from Egyptian slavery, lasting seven or eight days from the 15th day of Nisan. God commanded Moses to tell the Israelites to place a mark of lamb's blood above their doors in order that the Angel of Death would pass over them (i.e., that they would not be touched by the tenth plague, death of the firstborn). This year Passover begins at sunset on April 5 and ends at sunset on April 13.

Easter celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ who was crucified on Friday (Good Friday) and resurrected three days later on Sunday (Easter). The Council of Nicaea in AD 325 set the date of Easter as the first Sunday following the first full moon after the Spring Equinox. As Jesus' arrest and execution were said to have occurred during the Jewish observance of Passover, the Easter holiday is often close to that celebration on the Judeo-Christian calendar. This year Easter falls on April 9.





The Last Supper was essentially a Passover feast. However, the New Testament describes it as being given new significance by Jesus: He identified the matzah (or bread) he shared with his 12 apostles as his "body" and the cup of wine they drank as his "blood."

I want to remind everyone, especially Auxiliary Chaplains, that the 2022-2023 reporting year ends April 15. Please be sure that you have submitted your reports by then. Don't forget to fill out the Chaplain of the Year form. It can be found on the Department Website under Resources and then Of The Year Forms. I will be using these forms along with the online reports to choose the winners. No one will be considered unless I have received a form.



 - o Make sure the prospective member is in the right frame of mind
 - o Be aware of the emotions, feelings, and responses of the prospective member
 - o Arouse and sustain interest
 - K-I-S-S (Keep it short and simple!)

"Folks, I'm SO sorry it's taken this long to reply, I have been gone for well over a MONTH - I just returned from a week in (XXXX), after a week in (XXXX), after a week in (XXXX), and other places in between- now I'm catching up!

If you remember, we still have something like 5000 troops in (XXXX), another 6000 in (XXXX), around 100,000 in all of Europe - but as we speak, the first units that arrived when the war kicked off are now headed home and new ones are coming in to replace them.

As always, your care packages are a huge hit, all over. Here on this base, we only have a small PX with some of the necessities, but with 5000 troops and including the other country's troops - nothing lasts long on the shelves. anything like that is a big hit. They're living in tents, for the most part, with no kitchen facilities, but there's usually a microwave oven somewhere nearby. Please note, we don't need instant oatmeal packets or tuna, as they are in supply at the mess hall.

Once again, we can't thank you enough for your fantastic job, you're amazing, keep up the great work, only blessings to you and yours and everyone with you, and thank you again!
