A Message from the Department Treasurer October 2024 Vfwauxnc.org

Brothers and Sisters,

My first message this month comes from the VFW Department QM, Jenn Hutt. She has requested I remind the Auxiliaries when you order Buddy Poppies, please be sure to include the membership number of your Post QUARTERMASTER, not your membership number. The order form specifically asks for this information, but many are not reading this correctly. If the Quartermaster's membership number is not on the order form, it will delay your order. It could be returned to you to provide the correct information. The forms to order both the original poppy and the new tin poppy can be found on our website.

As a reminder, per our Department standing rules all checks issued by the Department must be cashed or deposited within 60 days. Any check not cashed within this time period will be voided. If the check is cashed after it has been voided, the Auxiliary or individual will be sent an invoice for the check and will be required to repay the amount to the Department. At the beginning of September, I had to void several checks that had been issued in June from Convention awards and membership. A list of the outstanding checks had been sent to the District Presidents to reach out to their Auxiliaries regarding the checks. I had 2 Auxiliaries contact me to say they never received the checks, so I was able to reissue those checks. If I am not contacted, the checks cannot be reissued. We really want every Auxiliary and individual to receive the money you have earned. Please be sure to deposit the checks as soon as you receive them.

Please remember that all donations for the Erline Mayberry Scholarship must be sent in a separate check from the other contributions/donations you make. The check should be made payable to the EMSF or spelled out, Erline Mayberry Scholarship Fund. The instructions for this are on the contribution form. Also, please remember to send your *District Dues* to your DISTRICT treasurer, not me. Sending them to delays your District receiving the dues, as I then have to mail them to your District treasurer.

It is AUDIT time again. Your Auxiliary audits for the quarter ending 30 September are due to me no later than 30 November. The Bylaws state the Audit should be completed during the month of October and sent to the Department treasurer (me) by 30 November. That should be ample time to complete the audit. Remember, the Treasurer is not to complete the audit. The Trustees are supposed to complete the audit using the financial information provided. Trustees must also audit the books of the secretary. Then the audit must be presented to and voted to be accepted by the Auxiliary before it is sent to me. Using the audit form that has been provided to you in the Department mail and our Department website, there is a line for you to provide this information. There is also a space on this form for you to include your savings account balance in the lower half of the audit, whereas some of the forms I have received do not. The upper and lower half of the audit **must balance.** When I review the audit, I find that the majority of the time the audit does not balance it is because of the savings account balance. So, please use the form that has been provided to you.

When completing membership applications, make sure each application has been reviewed for omissions of required information. I am still receiving applications without all of the information required to process. Also, if the veteran the applicant is joining under **was** a member of the VFW post they are joining, but is now deceased, the applicant must join as a NON-AFFILATED and provide all the required information: name of veteran, dates of service, medals/ribbons earned (as listed in our Bylaws book) and the location of **FOREIGN** service. Any military base in the United States is not a location of service. Recently I mentioned that if you did not actively recruit the new member do not put your name and membership number as the recruiter. Do not take credit for something you did not actually do. Awards are given from National and the Department for recruiting. A recruiter is not required on the application. If no one actively recruited the new member by talking to them about the wonderful things we do, the benefits of being a member and programs we support, then the first line of the application to complete is your Auxiliary number, City and state. Then complete the rest of the application based on the type of membership they are joining as.

As always, I am just a phone call or email away if there is anything I can assist you with.

many forms including such a sending care packages, hosting welcome home or deployment ceremonies, and offering emotional support to their families.

A strong supportive connection between the young men and women of our armed forces and the civilian communities they serve is crucial to troops morale. Unit members love receiving letters and care packages. These packages can be sent by your local auxiliary, schools and community groups. The Department Americanism Chairman must sign and send a copy of the completed Department-winning entry form to the National Americanism Ambassador by April 30, 2025 for judging.

Citations will be mailed directly to the winning VFW Auxiliaries from National Headquarters and money will be deposited into the winning VFW Auxiliary account after the 2025 VFW Auxiliary National Convention in Columbus, Ohio.

Awards for Departments and Department Chairmen

- \$25 VFW Store gift certificate to one Department Americanism Chairman in each of the 10 Program Divisions for the best promotion of lesser-known patriotic holidays.
- 2. The Outstanding Performance Award and Second-Place Outstanding Performance Award will be awarded in each of the 10 Program Divisions based on the criteria listed on Page 5 and for the promotion of the Program goals listed at the top of Page 9.

Winners will be announced and awards presented at the 2025 VFW Auxiliary National Convention in Columbus, Ohio.

The Selection:

The National Program Ambassadors of each Program listed will select the recipients. Department Chairmen will be judged on quality, creativity and originality of all communications, promotions and events. When a Department Chairman does anything to promote or publicize the Program to the members and the community, they should send a copy of the item or communication or a description of the event or presentation to the National Program Ambassador.

Required to qualify:

A minimum of four (4) mailed and/or emailed promotions to the members in their Department and must send copies to the National Ambassador by April 30, 2025.

Winners will be announced and awards presented at the 2025 VFW Auxiliary National Convention in Columbus, Ohio. If neither the winner nor Department leadership are in attendance, awards will be mailed to recipients from National Headquarters upon return from the VFW Auxiliary National Convention.

*Program Divisions will be announced at the start of the Program Year.

Auxiliary Outreach October 2024



October – the 10th month of the year. Opal is the birthstone and marigold is the traditional flower. Fall colors brighten the landscape. More than \$708 million are spent on pumpkins in October. Columbus "discovered" America on October 12, 1492. The 15th is National Grouch Day. France gifted the United States with the Statue of Liberty in 1886. Halloween is celebrated on the 31st. Watch out for those ghosts and goblins.

Auxiliary Outreach is about volunteering with other groups and organizations to bring recognition to the community about the VFW Auxiliary. This is why it is important to be sure that there is something identifying the VFW Auxiliary when you partner with other groups. Your name badge, shirt, hat, banner, etc., should be always used. Show your pride in our Auxiliary.



Partner with EMS, Fire, and Police Departments and visit rest homes, senior living accommodations for training in what to do in an emergency. Volunteer with "Habit for Humanity." Assist with roadside clean up. Assist with community beautification. Contact your town council, county commissioners and see if they need volunteers. You can even reach out to your state and offer to volunteer in state parks. The list is almost endless. Just remember that the activity cannot be reportable under any other program and must be voted on by the Auxiliary.

Good Auxiliary Outreach requires good planning. Start planning events at least two months in advance. Be sure to have the event approved and listed in your minutes. Since it's October, it's time to really start planning for December and January. Your plans for November should have been finalized by now.

Be sure to take lots of pictures of your event. You will need them to complete your collage. I must have your collage by March 31, 2025, for Department judging. The winning Auxiliary entry will be forwarded to National. There will be one winner in each of the 10 Program Divisions and the winner will receive a citation and \$25. I'd like to see at least one entry from each District.

Here we are again at a busy time of the year when our Auxiliary programs are taking off in many different directions. Last month, I asked that you review the August focus for the Hospital Program. (I know you're thinking, "What was that?"). But many of you recall, it was **AND** is:

Volunteer Recruitment, Recognition and Support

~ Why is this such an important part of the Hospital Program?

The VA hospitals are having more Veterans that need care. Even though the United States is not currently involved in a war, North Carolina VA's and other hospitals are beginning to see more patients with conditions due to Agent Orange from Viet Nam and contaminated water from Camp LeJeune. NC has one of the highest Veteran populations in the US and those who served in Viet Nam and at Camp LeJeune have over the past few years started to experience what their time in service did to them. Younger Veterans who served in Iraq, the Gulf War era and Post 9/11 have had exposure to burn pits, toxic fumes, and radiation. Visit VA.gov/PACT, which provides an abundance of information regarding medical conditions, which often result in medical care.

Hospitals are also having homeless veterans request food and water. I know at one VA hospital, several Auxiliaries have made *Blessing Bags* for these Veterans as well as set up a Hydration Station to pass out water to all Veterans as they enter the hospital. If your Auxiliary has provided a service such as these, please let me know to share with others across NC.

We can never do too much for our heroes!

<u>~ Who can be a volunteer?</u>

Anyone. Volunteers (adults & students) do not need to be members of the VFW/Auxiliary. The only requirement is to have approval by your Auxiliary and contact the Volunteer Office/Center for Development & Civic Engagement at one of our VA hospitals, non-Va hospitals, nursing homes, hospice, etc. in NC to let them know you would like to volunteer. Keep a record of the number of hours you volunteer and when the Auxiliary year is coming to a close, the attached form will be completed and signed by the person in charge of volunteers at the medical facility. That form will be sent to me for my signature and forwarded to National. Volunteers can receive a pin with as few as 150 hours – up to 10,000 hours. I know many of you give so much time to others and think it's nothing, but it is a sincere gift to many, which you need to be **Recognized and Supported** for your efforts.

Illustrating America: Is an art competition open to any student in grades k-8 who is enrolled in a public private, home school program.






