A Message from the Department Treasurer January 2025 Vfwauxnc.org



Brothers and Sisters,

I hope each of you had a wonderful and peaceful holiday season.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: It recently came to my attention that information was being shared with members that National was no longer sending out dues cards to annual members upon paying their dues for the current year. As Department treasurer, I was a little shocked, as I would have thought I would have heard this directly from National. I immediately contacted National regarding this and their response was "This is the first we are hearing about this". Please assure your members, if they have heard this, the information is incorrect. National does and will continue to send out dues card to every member upon receipt of the current dues. It generally takes approximately 5 weeks.

It is audit time once again. Your Auxiliary audits for the period ending 31 December 2024 will be due no later than 28 February 2025. Remember, the TRUSTEES are to review the books of the treasurer AND the secretary when completing the audit. Trustees should be making sure any expenditures were properly voted on by the Auxiliary prior to the money having been spent. Then the receipts must be presented to the trustees for final approval before the check was written. If the expenditure is pre-approved in the Auxiliary standing rules, the expense does not have to be voted on, but the receipts must still be presented to the trustees, signed and then the reimbursement may be made.

Additionally on your Audit form, there is a space that needs to be completed that indicates the date the audit was presented to the members of the Auxiliary, voted on and accepted. This is required according to the Bylaws. Sec 814-3 States A motion to accept the audit, signed and completed by the most senior trustee present at the audit is required, prior to forwarding to the Department treasurer. Section 814,7. States, the trustees shall submit <u>and read</u> the written audit during an Auxiliary meeting. Once this has been done, add the date to the audit and the forward the audit to the Department treasurer. This has been missing from many audits, requiring me to contact the Auxiliary to get the date and add it to the audit form.

Recently, the biggest issue with membership applications has been the life applications being paid by credit card. These applications have to be forwarded directly to National by me. In one week, I submitted 9 applications to National, only to have **6** of them declined and returned. The majority of these were for insufficient funds on the card. Please let the applicant know, it can take 30 days or more before the application is sent to National for processing. Consider the time from getting the application, waiting for the Auxiliary meeting to have the application reviewed, voted on and accepted by your Auxiliary and then sent to me. I then generally forward these directly to National within one or two days of receiving them. The applicant needs to make sure there are enough funds on the card to cover the fees when the application gets processed. If the card is declined, the application can only be processed with a different form of payment. It will not be re-sent with the same payment. One of the other problems is the credit card signature. If the card holders' name is not the same as the person who signs the credit card portion of the application, the application will be declined. So, if a spouse is paying for the membership, please make sure the spouse signs the application.

As a reminder the Auxiliary financial business is that of the Auxiliary only. You are not to share the information with others, including the VFW Post to which you are associated. Once a year, usually your 30 June audit, the Auxiliary is required to provide a financial report to the VFW Commander of their post. After this, the financial information of your Auxiliary does not get shared with the Post. If your Auxiliary is having difficulties with your audits, records, monies, etc., contact myself or the Department President. If needed, assistance will be sent to help remedy a solution.

As always, I am just a phone call or email away if there is anything I can assist you with.

With those options there are few child care programs that may be available on the weekend for active duty, such as your adopted unit for child care. How may your auxiliary help you might ask?



The Department of Defense and Child Care Aware® of America have launched the <u>Military Child</u> <u>Care in Your Neighborhood-PLUS</u> (MCCYN-PLUS) initiative in North Carolina. It provides financial assistance to help military families access and afford quality child care from community providers when on-base child care isn't available. Childcare can be expensive and time-consuming for anyone, but the American Heroes that are veterans may have some options to alleviate some of that stress.

The fourth focus, **Honors Escort**, as stated for the Hospital Program, "is an opportunity to honor each veteran in a respectful and open manner and provides an opportunity for a veteran's family and friends, other veterans and medical facility staff to participate in a display of high regard and reverence for the individual at the time of death."

? What is the Honors Escort ?

Unfortunately, many of our Auxiliary members do not understand or have never witnessed this brief ceremony. To enable your members to be enlightened on this meaningful event, use one of your meetings to see the following on

? What does our Auxiliary do next after we understand Honors Escort ?

- 1. Ask your VA CDCE Dept. (volunteer dept.) what the hospital does for Honors Escort? Some hospitals, nursing homes and hospice refer to the ceremony as Honors Walk. This may be in a non-VA medical facility.
- 2. You can also speak with the Hospital Chaplain.
- 3. If you volunteer at a non-VA medical facility, speak with the director or person in charge of volunteers.
- 4. Maybe your Auxiliary would like to make this a volunteer project!

If the facility does not have a ceremony, suggest they begin honoring their Veterans as you provide them with the *following page that will help them better understand Honors Escort*.

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and other non-VA health care facilities caring for veterans find meaning and take pride in providing a *final salute to veterans* who spend their last days of life at their facilities. The *final salute* aligns with the mission of the VA and to fulfill Pres. Lincoln's promise, *"To care for him who shall have borne the battle, and for his widow, and his orphan"* by serving and honoring those who are America's veterans.

HONORS ESCORT



UNWAVERING SUPPORT

This program offers a ceremonial escort to veteran patients who pass away while at a Medical Center, Community Living Center (CLC), Nursing Home, or Hospice.

The ceremony allows staff, residents, patients, and visitors to pay their final respects to the Veteran, and reminds family members of the high regard and reverence that is held for their loved one, even after they have passed on.

The ceremony is <u>normally</u> conducted by trained volunteer employees, and ensures that the veterans' service, accomplishments, and sacrifices are not forgotten as they are laid to rest.

VFW Auxiliaries are encouraged to talk with facilities in their area to encourage and assist them in establishing an HONORS ESCORT program or to volunteer to be part of the Honor Escort team.

Paying final respects to a Veteran is a difficult, yet honorable, task. Ceremonies will differ depending on the facility. In most VA facilities who have already implemented this program, when a veteran passes, a bell is rung throughout the campus.

The bell rings to honor the service and sacrifice of a Veteran who has died in the facility. It is a call for an honor escort and an opportunity for all to show respect for that person and his or her family and friends as they are escorted, on a special flag draped gurney, to the morgue or awaiting hearse.

Each Honors Escort unit performs their own individualized bedside service for the Veteran along with the Veteran's family. Next, the Veteran is transported to the appointed destination as the Honors Escort line the hallway and salute or place their hands on their heart out of respect.

Once at the appointed destination a flag folding ceremony takes place. Some units provide family members with a "token of appreciation" - a miniature American flags encased in a wooden triangle.

The Honors Escort program provides the veterans family a dignified procession that, hopefully, gives some measure of comfort from brothers and sisters in arms and a grateful nation.

LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM—JANUARY 2025 From Our Roots to Our Branches, Extend Service to Our Veterans. HAPPY NEW YEAR! IT'S TIME TO GET BACK TO WORK AND ENSURE THAT OUR ELECTED OFFICIALS DO THE RIGHT THING FOR OUR VETERANS AND MILITARY!





As I write this, Congress is again trying to avoid a **government shutdown panic** before leaving for Christmas! Just do the simple thing and quit loading up the pork! We the People aren't buying it. When there is a "government shutdown", only about 17% of the government actually shuts down. Only discretionary services stop, not the indispensable services. Everyone gets paid. Life goes on.

<u>THE 119th CONGRESS MEETS JANUARY 3, 2025, AT NOON</u>. Republicans will control the Senate, with a 53-47 majority, and the House by a slim margin. Senator John Thune (R-SD) will be the new majority leader in the Senate and Speaker Mike Johnson (R-LA) "plans to run again for his post", which will be the first order of business when the House meets in January. **BE ON THE LOOKOUT**, that might change. Two big legislative priorities for the Republican conference – secure the border and unleash American energy. Senator Chuck Schumer (D-NY) and Rep. Hakeem Jeffries (D-NY) will serve as minority leaders in their respective chambers.

SIGNED BY THE PRESIDENT AND ENACTED!

<u>H.R. 807</u>: Working Dog Commemorative Coin Act--To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the invaluable service that working dogs provide to society.

<u>H.R. 4190</u>: Restoring Benefits to Defrauded Veterans Act: To amend title 38, United States Code, to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to repay the estates of deceased beneficiaries for certain benefits paid by the Secretary and misused by fiduciaries of such beneficiaries.

PASSED BY CONGRESS AND SENT TO THE PRESIDENT TO SIGN!

<u>S. 2513</u>: Veterans Benefits Improvement Act of 2024--A bill to amend title 38, United States Code, to improve benefits administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes.

<u>H.R. 8371</u>: Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act-- To make certain improvements in the laws administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes.

<u>S. 141</u>: Elizabeth Dole Home Care Act--A bill to amend title 38, United States Code, to improve certain programs of the Department of Veterans Affairs for home and community-based services for veterans, and for other purposes.

<u>S. 2513</u>: Veterans Benefits Improvement Act of 2024: A bill to amend title 38, United States Code, to improve benefits administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes.

THE NC HOUSE AND SENATE OVERRIDE GOV. COOPER'S VETO TO MAKE SB3832 LAW!

The SB382 provides money for Western North Carolina hurricane victims. It transfers authority of our elections from the governor to the NC Auditor. Most significantly, the composition of county BOEs changes. There will still be five Board of Elections members. But the State chair of the two political parties having the highest number of registered affiliates as reflected by the latest registration statistics published by the State Board shall have the right to recommend to the State Board three registered voters in each county for appointment to the county board for that county. Specifically, SB 382 pushes up the deadline to process provisional and absentee ballots.
