# A Message from the Department Treasurer December 2024 Vfwauxnc.org



#### Brothers and Sisters,

I hope each of you had a wonderful Thanksgiving.

All officers and elected positions of each level must have their dues paid in time to reach National no later than 12.30.24. National will not be open on 12.31 to process dues. If you are an officer and have not paid your 2024-25, please do so immediately. Or consider converting your annual membership to a Life membership and never have to worry about this again. Any officer who has not paid their dues by this date will be removed from the office. In order to regain that position, you will have to be re-elected. You will not automatically be reinstated when you pay your dues. (as of the writing of this message on 11.14, there were 72 District and Auxiliary officers and elected positions, including some Presidents and treasurers who had not paid their dues. I hope this number is ZERO when I check again in December.)

Annual members should also pay their dues prior to 12.30. Any member who has not paid their dues will be considered "a member not in good standing". This means the member cannot attend meetings, participate in voting on Auxiliary decisions, etc., until their dues have been paid. Once they pay their dues, they may once again participate in all Auxiliary business. The Auxiliary treasurer or the Auxiliary membership committee should be contacting any member who has not paid their dues to get them collected. The Auxiliary could also consider paying the dues of any member who may be experiencing a difficult time right now. You would only need to pay the \$18 for the Department and National dues. This can come from your relief fund, your general fund, or allow a member to pay this on behalf of another member. Think how much it would mean to someone who has been a member for several years that their Auxiliary would care enough to pay their membership for them. And after you do it, send them a little note letting them know you have taken care of this. They will appreciate it even more.

I am still receiving audits from several Auxiliaries that are not on the Audit form for the Department of North Carolina. Some of the ones I receive don't have a place in the lower half for you to put the balance of your savings account, if your Auxiliary has one. This will cause your Audit to be out of balance and cannot be accepted. The other space these forms do not have is a place for you to indicate on which date the audit was presented to and accepted by the Auxiliary. Per section 814 A-3 in the Bylaws, this is a requirement. If this date is not present on your audit, I have to contact the Auxiliary treasurer to get this information. It will save a lot of time if each Auxiliary uses the same Audit form (which can be found on the Department website under Auxiliary forms) and provides the required information.

I urge all Trustees to open the Bylaws to section 814 and read what their responsibilities and duties are in conducting the audit. What records, financial statements, secretary minutes, everything you are to review and inspect during the audit. Which documents you are required to initial to show you actually reviewed them. If you are just signing an audit the treasurer completed without completing the audit yourself, and verifying the figures, then you are not honoring the obligation you took when you accepted this very important position.

I wish each of you a wonderful (and stress free) holiday season. Find time to spend with family and friends. Just breathe and relax.



# ? Have you reported <u>under Hospital</u> the <u>number and hours</u> of medical facility volunteers from your Auxiliary?

Only report the volunteer 1 time, not every time they go to a medical facility, <u>BUT keep a list of total hours committed to volunteering.</u> Be sure to designate if they are a \*Regularly Scheduled Volunteer (RS): participates in the VAVS Prog. on a regularly scheduled assignment under VA supervision.

- \*Occasional Volunteer: serves under the VAVS Prog. who does not meet the requirements of RS volunteers. Individuals who frequently volunteer with a group on an occasional basis.
- \*Sponsored Volunteers: non-members of the VFW Aux. who wish to serve under the Aux. sponsorship & supervision at VA and non-VA facilities.
- \*Student Volunteers: under the age of 18 & must have written parental/guardian approval to participate in the VAVS Program. Minimum age for volunteers is determined by the facility.
  - \* \* I have to report this information on the National Year-End Report.

#### ? Has your Auxiliary Recognized, Retained and Recruited volunteers?

Volunteers need to be *Recognized, Retained* and *Recruited* for their time and commitment for wanting to help our Veterans and their families. Remember that many members cannot physically go to a facility, but they can knit, crochet, make tray favors and more – this is great volunteering! A personal "thank you", phone calls, a note with a candy kiss attached are suggestions. Certificates are available in Malta (go to Programs & click on Hospital. Two available certificates will be found at end of list.) for all volunteers.

# ? Have you thought about inviting President Sandra to attend your Quarterly VAVS Meeting and taking a tour of your VA hospital?

As of this writing, I know she has attended two VA Quarterly VAVS Meetings and was impressed with the valuable information that was provided to not only the VFW and Auxiliaries, but also other organizations who attend and volunteer at the hospitals. When she tours the VA hospitals, she looks forward to presenting a \$500 check from the NC VFW State Auxiliary. Be sure to report your \$20 required contribution under Hospital.

The support year goes from October until September. In the 2022-23 year we had monetary donations of \$750. In 2023-24 year we your donations increased to \$3740.32! I was blown away. This store contains many of the items needed by the veterans, including clothing, shoes, personal hygiene, snacks for the units, etc. Your Auxiliary or personal donation will be given credit for any donation made through the Patriot Store. With these gift cards, if Kendra receives a request for items for a Veteran, she will be able to contact the store, and they will use the gift cards to purchase the items. #### LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM—DECEMBER 2024

As I write this, there are a few Congressional races still to be decided and a probable recount race here in NC! See the results of the election.

NC PASSES CITIZEN-ONLY VOTING AMENDMENT: The citizens-only voting amendment to the state constitution of NC passed on election night with 77 percent in favor and almost 23 percent against. This amendment allows only citizens to vote in an election in the state of North Carolina. Earlier this year, Speaker Tim Moore, R-Cleveland, introduced HB 1074 to amend the language in the state constitution to clarify that only citizens can vote in any election in the state. The bill passed in the House 99-12 and in the Senate 40-4 in June. Following the bill's passage in the General Assembly, the amendment was put on the ballot.

<u>WATCH OUT FOR THOSE LAME DUCKS!</u> What it is: an elected official or group (Congress & the President) continuing to hold political office during the period between the election and the inauguration of a successor.

Congress has a short but important to-do list as lawmakers, now that they have returned to Washington for what is known as a lame-duck session. Such as keeping the federal government open; providing more disaster aid; passing a defense policy bill; and for Senate Democrats, confirming more judges.

<u>THE 119th CONGRESS MEETS JANUARY 3, 2025, AT NOON</u>. Republicans will control the Senate, with a 53-47 majority, and the House. Senator John Thune (R-SD) will be the new majority leader in the Senate and Speaker Mike Johnson (R-LA) plans to run again for his post, which will be the first order of business when the House meets in January. Senator Chuck Schumer (D-NY) and Rep. Hakeem Jeffries (D-NY) will serve as minority leader in their respective chambers.

REPUBLICANS ARE ALAREADY MAKING BIG PLANS FOR THE 119<sup>TH</sup> CONGRESS, many of which center on using a legislative maneuver called reconciliation. GOP leaders have suggested they are planning a mammoth-sized bill to implement President-elect Trump's tax policies, lower the federal deficit and enact conservative policies early next year. Reconciliation is a way to fast-track legislation on issues like taxes, the debt limit and federal spending by bypassing the Senate's 60-vote threshold for passage, instead lowering it to a simple 51-vote majority. Two big legislative priorities for their conference – secure the border and unleash American energy.

<u>REMEMBER, AS I SAID LAST MONTH, KEEP OUR MOMENTUM GOING!</u> Reach out to newly elected officials and introduce yourself. Keep in contact with current representatives. Know where they stand on veterans' rights and issues and then let our voices be heard! Don't forget our local elected officials, including NC State and House members in the General Assembly! Write letters, make phone calls and send emails. Invite them to you post for special events or patriotic celebrations so that you and your members can speak to them personally!

<u>CONTINUTE WORKING ON THE BASICS</u>: study the VFW Legislative Priority Goals; read and RESPOND to the VFW Action Corps Weekly; stay up to date on pending legislation, both state and federal.
