VFW Policy reminders:

- Auxiliary Members are not custodians of any of the Bingo monies, keno monies, canteen monies, or licenses for the same. The Post Quartermaster is the only authorized custodian for these funds. Please remember this.
- Any donated items or artifacts that are given to the post to put on display for a limited amount of time must get a
 receipt on when you want it back. You do not have permission to remove it without getting permission for it be



- returned. This policy was recently updated in our revised bylaw book at National 2024-2025. Charges can be brought up by the post.
- Any agreements between the Post and the Auxiliary must be in writing. Whether it is a standing operating procedure, bylaws with specifics, or a memorandum of understand that may involve monies, or work assignments with other responsibilities involved must be documented.

In closing, please remember the State of California in your prayers. Our VFW has a link on their website if you personally or your Auxiliary would like to donate to help them out. A few months ago, it was us and they did great things to help us. Let's return the favor. A Message from the Department Treasurer February Vfwauxnc.org



Brothers and Sisters,

Recently, I have been hearing that Auxiliaries are being told they no longer are required to have a ledger. This information is incorrect. Always review your Bylaws if you have any doubt as to your duties and requirements. Page 18 in the Booklet of instruction (yellow pages) of the Bylaws, Section L1 list some of the Duties of the Auxiliary/District treasurer. #1 States, "Under receipts, the Treasurer will report the amount of dues received from each member since the previous meeting. Any discrepancies will be checked immediately Following the meeting, the Treasurer will enter the dues in the **Treasurer's bound ledger, cashbook or computerized system.".** This tells you every Auxiliary and District **must** have a ledger of receipts and expenditures. Under the duties of the Trustees, they are instructed to review the ledger book as well as the checkbook, bank statements and other financial documents.

Any receipts submitted for reimbursement must have had the expense approved by a vote of the Auxiliary BEFORE the receipt may be reimbursed Unless the expense is pre-approved in your Standing rules, such as for postage. If a member purchases items for the Auxiliary, for any reason, that were not voted on prior to making the purchase, then that purchase becomes a donation. If the Auxiliary is planning an event and items are purchased for the event, the receipts are then presented to the trustees for approval, signed by the trustees and given to the treasurer for the reimbursement to be made. All receipts must be approved and signed by the trustees. All receipts must be clear, as well as the items purchased. The receipts should not contain items that weren't intended for the Auxiliary.

When submitting an application for membership to the Department for processing, be sure to keep a copy of the application for your records. The original shall be kept in the Auxiliary's application file until the applicant has been deceased for a period of 6 years or has reached 120 years of age. The original application should be given to the treasurer. A duplicate should be sent to the Department treasurer. However, please make sure the copy is clean and clear so there will be no difficulty in reading the information.

Please refer to section 920 Property Ownership (pages 96-97) of the Bylaws. Real property vs. personal property is defined. It also gives details regarding donations to the VFW Post, District or Department. Any personal property acquired by an Auxiliary and donated by a majority vote of the Auxiliary with the intent for the item to remain with the real property or facility owned by the VFW, shall remain the property of the VFW. Any personal property donated by an Auxiliary to the VFW MAY NOT be reclaimed by the Auxiliary, District or Department without the consent of the VFW organization. In other words, once you have donated or given any property to the VFW you may NOT take it back without their permission.

District dues are sent to your District treasurer, not to the Department treasurer. When these come to me, I then have to return them to the Auxiliary. This delays your dues getting to the District in a timely manner. Donations to the EMSF must be written in a separate check, as instructed on the contribution form. When it is included with other contributions, it must be deposited in the Department General fund account and then the Department treasurer must write a check from the Department General fund account to the EMSF. This is unnecessary extra work that can easily be avoided by the Auxiliary simply sending a separate check. Also, please make sure you are using the 2024-25 Contribution sheet., found on the Department website.

As always, if there is anything I can do to assist you, please reach out.

Hello brothers and sisters as the cold weather is setting in and there is not a lot going on outside here is something to remember about military mental health, it is a critical aspect of overall well-being for service members. The unique challenges faced by military personnel, such as exposure to combat, prolonged separation from family, and the stress of military life, can significantly impact mental health. Common mental health issues among military members include post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), depression, anxiety, and substance abuse.

Efforts to address these issues include providing access to mental health services, promoting resilience and coping strategies, and reducing the stigma associated with seeking help. Support systems, such as counseling, peer support groups, and family programs, play a vital role in helping service members maintain their mental health and well-being.

Although May is mental health awareness month it's essential to continue raising awareness and improving resources to ensure that military personnel receive the care and support they need. Invite a certified counselor into your VFW post to speak with Veterans and their families about issues that may concern you. Here are a few resources you may want to use.

Did You Know?

Washington's Birthday honors George Washington the first President of the United States. Congress first honored George Washington with a federal holiday on February 22,1879 (his actual Birthday). On January 1,1971, Congress shifted to the federal holiday to the third Monday of the month. The holiday honors the accomplishments of Washington, who created the first military badge of merit for the common soldier, the PURPLE HEART MEDAL (which was revived on Washington's 200th Birthday in 1932 and bears his image) it is awarded to soldiers who are injured in battle.

Flag Education for Kids! This is to help you know how to take good care of the Flag of the United States of America!

FOR UNCOMMON HEROES

Displaying the Flag:

- On Same Staff: U.S. flag at very top, above any other flag
- Grouped with other flags: U.S. flag goes to its own right. Flags of other nations are flown at same height.
- (observer's left). Marching with other flags: U.S. flag to marcher's right
- with the blue on top, then white, then red Decoration: Never use the flag for decoration. Use bunting

Half Staff (Halfway up the flag pole):

- On special days, the flag may be flown at half-staff
- On Memorial Day it is flown at half-staff until Noon and then raised

Saluting the U.S. Flag

- Everyone in uniform should use the military salute
- but not in uniform, may use the military salute Members of the armed forces and veterans who are present,
- Everyone else should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart.
- It you are wearing anything on your head, take it off with being over the heart. your right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand

Don't do this!!!

- Do not let the flag touch the ground
- Do not fly flag upside down unless there is an emergency.
- Do not carry the flag flat, or carry things in it
- Do not use the flag as clothing.
- Do not store the flag where it can get dirty
- Do not use it as a cover.
- Do not fasten it or tie it back. Always allow it to fall free.
- Do not draw on or otherwise mark the flag

Flag Disposal:

This should only be done with adult supervision!

- The flag should be folded in its customary manner
- It is important that the fire be fairly large and of sufficient intensity to ensure complete burning of the flag.
- Place the flag on the fire.
- The individual(s) can come to attention, salute the flag silent reflection. recite the Pledge of Allegiance and have a brief period of
- After the flag is completely consumed, the fire should then be safely extinguished and the ashes buried
- Please make sure you are conforming to local/state fire codes or ordinances

Fortunately, the **Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act** was passed and signed into law in the final days of the previous Congress. This bipartisan, bicameral legislative package was a significant and long overdue victory for transitioning service members, veterans, caretakers, and survivors. However, there was much unfinished work on other important legislation. The <u>VFW 2025 Priority Goals</u> include many issues that still need to be addressed. We will continue to advocate diligently to ensure the newly seated Congress provides the resources and care our nation's veterans and their families have earned and deserve.

<u>THE 119th CONGRESS—READY, SET, START OVER!</u> Around 100 veteran related bills died with the end of the 118th Congress and must be reintroduced.

Funding now expires on March 14, 2025. It will be the responsibility of the 119th Congress to grab the bull by the horns and immediately begin enacting reforms that grow the economy, cut wasteful spending, and restructure the government to serve the interests of the American people.

<u>U.S. SENATE</u>: Our NC Senator Thom Tillis has assignments with Veterans Affairs and Judiciary Committees; and Senator Ted Budd with the Armed Services Committee.

\$61M Veterans Affairs clinic planned in Jacksonville:

U.S. Rep. Greg Murphy recently announced that the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs has selected a location for a new, state-of-the-art outpatient clinic on Western Boulevard in Jacksonville. (Congressman Murphy is also collaborating on an approach to PTSD and TBI using Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy.)

SIGNED BY THE PRESIDENT AND ENACTED!

H.R. 7365: VETS Safe Travel Act--To provide Precheck to certain severely injured or disabled veterans, and for other purposes.

<u>THE NC HOUSE AND SENATE</u>: The new year brought new laws for the state of North Carolina. As part of the 2023 budget bill, the individual **income tax rate is set to decrease** from 4.5 percent to 4.25 percent this year and further to 3.99 percent in 2026. There is also the <u>controversial Senate Bill 382</u>, which provides funding for Hurricane Helene relief efforts also alters how the Board of Elections is appointed, moves up several post-election deadlines in 2025 and changes how state Supreme Court vacancies are filled.

Tips and Tricks!

- (1) What is the acronym CMR? Comprehensive Membership Report
- lt's Jan 1, can a member who <u>has not renewed dues</u> count towards quorum, vote at meetings, or hold a position with the Auxiliary? No, a member ceases to be in good standing on January 1, immediately following the year for which dues have been paid. Remember that the membership year of the Auxiliary is from Jan 1 to Dec 31.
- As a line officer, how do I quickly see who needs to remit their dues for the ensuing year?
 - 1. Log into MALTA.
 - 2. Click on the tab "Duties"
 - 3. Click on Reports



- 4. Find the report titled "Unpaid Members Report" and click the link
- 5. You'll select the drop-down box for Auxiliary and find your number (its likely it's the only number available)



- 6. Then click on View Report.
- 7. This will give you information on each person who still needs to renew memberships.
- 8. Make phone calls to each to ask them to please re-join and let them know the benefits of continuous membership.
- 4 How do members know how and where to submit membership renewals?



COMMON MISTAKES & HELPFUL HINTS

The VFW Auxiliary's Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest & 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contest provide an incredible scholarship opportunity for young artists while promoting patriotism throughout schools and home school associations. Follow the advice below to ensure that every student who enters the contest has the best possible chance of realizing his or her dreams.



USING THE U.S. FLAG

As a powerful symbol of our country, the U.S. Flag is often used in art entries. It can also be a source of problems for judges and Auxiliary Chairmen. When notifying schools, homeschool associations and students about the contest, give them a copy of the Federal Flag Code and encourage participants to closely examine the U.S. Flag before using it in their art.

COMMON MISTAKES:

- Not enough stars or stripes.
- Stripes in the wrong order or place.
- The Flag appearing to have someone standing on it, or something written or lying on it

HINT: It is always best to portray the Flag as waving freely.

<u>APPLICATION</u> (One application for each contest)

When a student submits an art entry and contest application, check for the following:

- Print or legible writing. If you can't decipher the writing, chances are we can't either.
- Address with city, state and ZIP code.
- Phone number with area code.
- Email address. This is used for all notifications.
- Signature of both student and parent or guardian.
- Source- this must be complete even if it states "original idea."
- Media used.
- Title of art entry.
- An artist statement, essay and detailed description of the art entry and how it was made.
- Signatures of participating/sponsoring VFW Auxiliary Scholarships Chairman and Department Scholarships Chairman.
- Art entries not sponsored by a VFW Auxiliary will not be judged and will be returned to the student.



PACKING THE ART

VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters is not responsible for art lost or damaged during shipment. Please take in consideration that the art entry may be very fragile and will be shipped over many miles and encounter weather condition's.

- Use the correct size packaging.
- Use paper, bubble wrap, air pillows, cushioning and/or foam shippers.
- Label the package clearly to insure deadline arrival.



Contest Eligibility

- Student does not have to be related to a VFW or VFW Auxiliary member to participate
- Students in grades K-8 by March 31 deadline who are enrolled in a public, private, parochial or home school program in the United States, its territories and possessions, or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools.
- Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent resident (the application for which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen.
- Foreign exchange students, students aged 15 or older are not eligible.
- Previous winners of VFW Auxiliary National Illustrating America Art Contests are not eligible for the same grade division of which they are a previous national winner. However, the students may enter the subsequent grade division.

Contest Rules

- Entry must be completed during the current school year.
- Entry must be two dimensional.
- Entry must be on canvas or paper.
- Canvas entries must be submitted on a stretcher frame or canvas board.
- Paper entries must be reinforced with heavy paper.
- Do not frame art with wood, metal, plastic or glass.
- Mats may be used, including mounted and floating mats.
- Entries may not be smaller than 8"x10" and not larger than 18"x24" including mat.
- Acrylic, chalk, crayon, ink, marker, pastel, pen, pencil, tempera, watercolor, glitter or other media may be used.
- If the American Flag is used, it does not need conform to the Federal Flag Code in relation to colors, numbers of stars and stripes and other pertinent rules of the code.
- Coloring sheets, digital art and photography are not accepted.
- Completed typed or printed legible entry form including parent and/or guardian signatures.
