# The Orthodox Church

The Orthodox church traces their beginnings to Palestine, Rome, and Armenia. The Orthodox Bible has more books than the Christian Bible. It is practiced in Eastern Europe, the Middle East, and the Far East.

In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth. Genesis 1:1

There are two main branches – Eastern (Greek) and Asian (Coptic). The dispute between them is about the divine and human nature of Jesus.



Orthodox members are not under the authority of the Roman Catholic Pope. Their current leader, Ecumenical Patriarch of Constantinople is Bartholomew. He is the 270<sup>th</sup> successor of Christ's apostle St. Andrew, the brother of St. Peter.

It is the second largest Christian church with approximately 220 members worldwide. Most members are in eastern Europe, the middle East, and the far East.

In 1045, the Great Schism occurred between Rome and Constantinople. The Church Catholic Church started excluding the Eastern members in religious doctrine. The 4<sup>th</sup> Crusade in 1204 captured and sacked Constantinople because they considered all Byzantines to be infidels. The final break occurred in 1450. Pope John Paul II issued a formal apology to the Orthodox church in 2004 for the capture of Constantinople.

Each day of the week has its own special meaning.

**Sunday** – Christ's crucifixion

**Monday** – Bodiless powers – angels, archangels, etc.

**Tuesday** – Prophets – especially John the Baptist

Wednesday – the Cross

Thursday – Apostles and hierarchs

**Friday** – recalls the day of the crucifixion

Saturday – all saints – especially the Mother of God

Over the past months, we have explored different religions. There are many that I did not touch on, these were only a few. It has been my hope that you have read these and that you are more aware of the different beliefs. No one belief is right or wrong. They are simply different. We should tolerate the uniqueness of others and strive to understand them.



# The Guard VA Benefits Act (H.R. 1139)

protects veterans from unaccredited lawyers and other agents who charge money to help veterans draw their benefits.


As of 3/17/2023, it is still in the House Committee on Veterans Affairs, so if your Department has representatives on the committee, encourage them to vote yes. The bill has 74 co-sponsors. Use this link to see if your congressperson is among them. If not, you know what to do.

# The Major Richard Star Act (S.344)



is another bill that should have passed last but didn't. It was reintroduced by Jon Tester (D-Mont.) on February 9. Currently, disabled veterans with fewer than 20 years of creditable service have their retirement pay reduced dollar for dollar when they receive disability compensation. This is all kinds of wrong. The Major Richard Star Act fixes this mistake so that disabled veterans don't have to choose.

It is still in the Senate Committee on Veterans Affairs. Contact your representatives who serve on the committee and let them know that the VFW endorsed it this time, endorsed it last time and they should as well.
