Brothers and Sisters,

Just a few reminders for you this month.

- ❖ Your audits for the period ending 12.31.23 are due to me no later than 2.28.24. Please make sure the audits are completed in accordance with the Bylaws and presented for a vote of acceptance by your Auxiliary before sending them in.
- ❖ Credit cards MAY NOT be used for initial payment of dues on a new application for ANNUAL members. These members must give your Auxiliary cash or a check for the amount of your Auxiliary dues, which you deposit into your account. Then you send the \$13 (Department and National dues) to me with the properly completed application for processing.
- ❖ When sending contributions to the Department, *please* use the Department contribution form that can be found on the Department website. This makes it absolutely clear where you intend the monies in your check to be distributed. It is also important for record keeping. In the event that I make a mistake (and yes I do), I can easily refer back to the contribution form to find the error.
- ❖ There are still many applications being sent in with missing information that is required for processing. I have previously sent out hints on completing an application and listed all of the required fields that must be completed before I can process the application into MALTA. Refer to our Bylaws as to which Campaign medals and/or ribbons are acceptable. A purple heart or bronze star do not qualify as medals under our Bylaws. This month I am attaching a document that gives the Investigating committee guidelines on what they need to be checking the application for prior to presenting the application for a vote. This document can also be found on the Department website under "Duties of Officers/committees". Please print it out and let the members of the Auxiliary review it, as any member may serve on the investigating committee.
- ❖ And finally, just another reminder, please make all checks payable to **Department of NC VFW Auxiliary**. This is per the bank. Checks for the Earline Mayberry Scholarship are made payable to that fund.

I hope to see many of you at the Council of Administration meeting in Greensboro.

Please reach out to me anytime you have questions or concerns regarding your Auxiliary or District treasurer or trustee duties and responsibilities.

Duties of the Membership/transfer Application Investigating Committee

- ✓ A Committee of 3 is appointed by the President. The committee cannot include the President, or the member recommending the applicant. The Auxiliary treasurer should also not be on the committee. Any member in good standing may be a member of the committee. It does not have to be the trustees.

Prior to presenting the application to the membership for a vote the Investigating committee should thoroughly review the application to make sure all required information has been provided. PLEASE make sure the application is neat AND legible. The information needs to be able to be read to be entered in the system.

- ✓ The committee DOES NOT have to be the same three members for each application. It can be any 3 members in attendance at the meeting.

Filling In the Auxiliary Membership Application: (These are the things the Investigating Committee should be looking for.)

***The member recruiting the applicant MUST include their name AND membership number on the application in order to receive credit for the recruitment. ***

- ✓ Section A:
 - All areas are required. Name AND membership number of member recruiting the new member. Please make sure the Auxiliary Number, City & State are included. IF the member is a REJOIN, their previous membership number must be included. Make sure the type of membership is marked on the application. (This determines the amount of dues required with the application.) If the member is transferring from another Auxiliary, make sure the previous Auxiliary Number and location are included. (Out of state transfers must be sent to National for processing, by the Department treasurer. See below)
- ✓ Section B:
 - Everything in this section must be completed. Especially the date of birth. The complete address, including the ZIP code, must be completed. Without the date of birth, the application cannot be processed. They do not have to provide their phone number or email address if they choose not to. However, without an email address, the member will not receive information from National such as the magazine and newsletter.
- ✓ Section C and D
 - If the applicant is eligible to join under a current member of the Post, complete Section C of the application. The VFW Membership number is required to process. If Section C is completed, it is not necessary to provide any information in Section D. (Important Note: If spouses are joining on the same night, the spouse joining the Auxiliary CANNOT apply as a Post affiliated member as the spouse joining the VFW will not have a membership number to be put on the application. The spouse joining the Auxiliary will have to join as a Non-affiliated, show the proof of eligibility and complete section D) Another point, if the Post member is deceased, they are no longer affiliated with the Post. Therefore, the applicant would complete Section D, and show the proof of eligibility with the proper documentation.
 - Section D: *THE INVESTIGATING COMMITTEE IS REQUIRED TO VIEW THE PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY, SUCH AS THE DD-214. HOWEVER, ONCE THIS DOCUMENT HAS BEEN REVIEWED, RETURN THIS TO THE APPLICANT. DO NOT KEEP IT AND DO NOT SEND IT WITH THE APPLICATION FOR PROCESSING.* This section is required if the applicant is not joining under a VFW member of their Post. (Even if the Veteran is a member of another VFW Post.) Campaign medals and ribbons are required. Check in the Bylaws book as to which medals are acceptable HINT: A Purple Heart medal or Bronze medal do not qualify. If you have a doubt, check with your Post Quartermaster for clarification. The dates of service in the Foreign location of service must be listed. And finally, the Location of Foreign Service must be listed.
- ✓ Section E
 - The members of the investigating committee sign here only after they have thoroughly reviewed the proof of eligibility and the completed application. The areas of meeting date and accepted must be filled in but may be completed by the Auxiliary treasurer prior to sending the application.

- ✓ Section F
 - Make sure the application is signed and dated by the applicant. The member is not required to receive the formal obligation as found in the Bylaws once they have signed the application, although even the shortened version is a nice ceremony welcoming the new member.
- ✓ Credit Card Information
 - This information can be provided ONLY if the member is joining as a Life member. Credit cards may not be used to pay initial annual dues, as stated on the application. If credit card information is provided, verify a signature and date are provided. Any application with credit card information needs to be submitted within 3 months of the date on the signature. These applications get sent directly to National. After 3 months National considers a signature “dead” and will not accept it.

Collection of DUES: The applicant’s dues, whether paid by cash or check should only be accepted and deposited into the Auxiliary account after the application has been approved and voted on by the members.

- ❖ On Member Transfers the application, the committee should verify the following information:
 - All transfer are submitted to the Department treasurer.
 - You are required to see the current membership card of the transfer applicant.
 - Section A. Include the name and membership number of the member recommending the applicant. Include the Auxiliary Number, City and State the member is transferring to. Make sure the correct type of transfer is marked on the application. The transferring members’ membership number has to be included on the application. The Previous Auxiliary number and location information is required. Out of State transfers are sent to National for processing. If it is an annual membership converting to Life, the required amount of dues needs to be provided with the application.
 - Section B needs to be completed to make sure all of the member’s information is correct in MALTA. Again, they do not need to provide a phone number or email address if they choose not to.
 - Proof of eligibility is NOT required on a transfer, if the member is a current member in good standing. This information was provided when they first joined the Auxiliary.
 - Section E. Again, the committee members sign after they have thoroughly reviewed the application for accuracy.
 - Section F. The transfer application must be signed by the member.

This may seem like a lot of information to be verified. It is the responsibility of the investigating committee to assure we are only voting in applicants that are eligible to join. It is very important the applications be complete and there are no omissions of the required information. If there are, the application gets returned to the Auxiliary to get the application corrected/completed. This delays the member in becoming an ‘official’ member in the Auxiliary. By official, I mean in the MALTA system at National with a membership number. Until a membership number is received the applicant may not be elected to an office or appointed to an office. They may sit on a committee, attend meetings, and vote as they have been accepted by the Auxiliary.

Once all of this is completed, the application is given to the Auxiliary treasurer to send to the Department treasurer with the required amount of dues, based on the type of membership.

February is notable for valentine's day, but there is another observation during that week that has special significance for anyone with a veteran family member receiving medical care. The National Salute to Veteran Patients happens the week of Feb. 14 and pays tribute to many patients a day that receive medical treatment in VA medical facilities as well as the millions of U.S. veterans who get care every year. According to the Department of Veterans Affairs, the week- long tribute to veteran patients has always been observed the week of Valentine's Day and is intended to: **Pay tribute to veterans, increase community awareness "of the role of the VA medical center", encourage visits to hospitalized veterans, to encourage volunteerism with the VA.**

However, in 1968 Congress passed the Monday Holiday Law to ‘provide uniform annual observances of certain legal public holidays on Mondays.’ By creating more 3-day weekends, Congress hoped to ‘bring substantial benefits to both the spiritual and economic life of the Nation.’ “One of the provisions of this act changed the observance of Washington’s Birthday from February 22nd to the third Monday in February. Ironically, this guaranteed that the holiday would never be celebrated on Washington’s actual birthday, as the third Monday in February cannot fall any later than February 21.

One of the places that you can look for places to assist is your local chamber of commerce. You can look on their website and calendar of events. This is a great resource for finding activities other organizations have planned. Keep checking in with your local Senior Center, First Responders, Recreational Dept., and Libraries.

Auxiliary Outreach Check list

Find organization to assist with their project.

Auxiliary Vote to assist.

Wear Auxiliary attire.

Do not plan or spend money.

Donate your Time and Service

Help make their project or event a success.

Try to include as many auxiliary members as you can to participate.

Things to Remember When Reporting

Report back to your Auxiliary how it went. The hours and number of members that assisted. What you did to donate your time and service. This should be recorded in your minutes.

When reporting remember that chairman are looking at your report; They need you to answer all questions and details about the organization and what you did.

Before you Report under Auxiliary Outreach. Look at your other programs and make sure it is not reportable under another program. You need to put it under that Program.

Extension and Revitalization sounds pretty straightforward, right? **Extension** = new Auxiliary. **Attention District Presidents!** Does your district have a Post without an Auxiliary? Reach out to the Commander (or other comrade) to ask if there is an interest in instituting an Auxiliary for their Post. I'm asking Tracy to include a page from MALTA that will help you start the conversation with the Post member. This process takes more than a few weeks to complete, so don't be afraid to start now. If you have a Post that is interested in having an Auxiliary, ask for permission to come to one of their meetings to present the advantages of having an Auxiliary, and to answer questions. If you get a positive response from a Post interested in instituting an Auxiliary, please let me or our Department President Connie know. Since we just organized and instituted an Auxiliary in District 5, we can walk you through the steps. I'd like to point out that our VFW Department Commander was the Representative at our District meeting, and she asked everyone in attendance to work together to grow our organization. She reminded everyone that when we recruit a new member, we have the opportunity to increase membership in the Post and the Auxiliary.

Revitalization = assisting an existing Auxiliary. Is your Auxiliary struggling to have a quorum, or not accomplishing much at your monthly meeting? Contact your District President for help. Don't wait until the District President shows up for the official visit. Reach out now! Do not be embarrassed to ask for help. Attend your District and Department meetings. These meetings are designed to provide you with information to keep your Auxiliary viable. I heard someone remark after our last District meeting that they were glad they came because it energized them and made them want to continue working to improve their Auxiliary. You've heard the old expression "stuck in a rut" and sometimes that is how you feel about going to your Auxiliary meeting. That is not uncommon. Sometimes we feel like things are stagnant and there is a lack of motivation. You may not be the only person who feels like the Auxiliary has lost its direction. It can be fixed. First, assess the situation. You could have the members get together outside of the regular meeting for the purpose of brainstorming ways to get back on track. Listen to everyone's ideas without judgment. Don't be afraid to try new things. Think big, but start small. Don't lose sight of the Auxiliary's objectives. You don't have to do everything at once. Pick one goal, and strive to make that one event successful. Even a large project can be made more simple by breaking it down into small, manageable steps. Other advantages of using the small, one step at a time ideology is that allows you to stay focused, and it provides for more opportunities to celebrate success. Those successes will inspire others to participate. Who can resist being a part of a positive thinking, successful organization? So, reach out to your District President and/or Department chairmen for advise whenever you feel the need for encouragement.

Frequently Asked Questions

- **Does it cost the Post anything?**
The VFW Auxiliary Charter Kit fee is \$100.00. The Post and/or Department and/or the interested, eligible applicants may pay the Charter fee. The Charter fee accompanies the completed Charter application.
- **How long does it take to start?**
From the time your Post votes to have an Auxiliary, it could take from two (2) to four (4) months to get an Auxiliary up and running.

Ready to Add an Auxiliary to your Post?

- In accordance with the VFW Bylaws, a notice is to be mailed or emailed to each Post member advising them that members will be voting on having an Auxiliary and that the vote will take place at a specific meeting.
- In accordance with the VFW Bylaws, a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Post members present is required to set into action the formation of a new Auxiliary to that Post.
- Inform the Department President of the approval and the Department President will then assign an Auxiliary Organizer who will work on obtaining the required number of charter members (15) and filling out necessary paperwork.

IS A VETERAN IN CRISIS? DIAL 988, PRESS 1. Suicide Prevention is Close to Our Hearts! Keep the LOVE GOING and share the crisis prevention number:

ON CAPITAL HILL: Arguments, tensions and funding our government continues! Boy if we didn’t do our jobs on time we would be fired! LOL!

In January, U.S. Senators **Marsha Blackburn** (R-Tenn.), **Tommy Tuberville** (R-Ala.) and House Veterans Affairs Committee Chairman **Mike Bost** (R-Ill.) introduced legislation to stop Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) resources from being used to provide taxpayer-funded healthcare to illegal aliens. ***“Our nation’s veterans deserve nothing less than the very best care we have to offer,”*** said Senator **Blackburn**. The Department of Veterans Affairs Processed 161,000 Medical and Dental Claims for ILLEGALS in 2022 while Delaying Service to US VETERANS.

Passed in the House in December and goes to the Senate next for consideration. We need to be as aggressive and successful with any companion bills in the Senate. Contact both of our Senators, Tillis & Budd!

- **H.R. 3581: COPE Act:** To amend title 38, United States Code, to modify the family caregiver program of the Department of Veterans Affairs to include services related to mental health and neurological disorders, and for other purposes.
- **H.R. 542: Elizabeth Dole Home Care Act of 2023:** To amend title 38, United States Code, to improve certain programs of the Department of Veterans Affairs for home and community-based services for veterans.
- **H.R. 3848: Housing our Military Veterans Effectively Act of 2023:** To make certain improvements in the laws administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs relating to homelessness, and for other purposes.

State lawmakers returned to Raleigh on January 11, 2023, to jump-start the session by swearing in members and electing officers. Senator Phil Berger (R-Rockingham) was elected to a seventh term as President Pro Tempore of the N.C. Senate, while Rep. Tim Moore (R-Cleveland) was chosen to serve a record fifth consecutive term as House Speaker. For info on the **General Assembly** go to: <https://www.ncleg.gov/>



Who can be a mentor? Anyone! In fact, you can be a mentor and not even know it. Many years ago when I started attending the Department convention and council meetings, I started watching the Department line officers. A couple of those women inspired me to want to become “one of them.” To me, they were always in proper attire, and carried themselves in such a manner that I wanted to emulate their achievements. They probably did not know (at the time) that they were such an inspiration to me. Years later when I finally thought I could carry on in their footsteps, and after years of serving at the Auxiliary and District levels, I became a candidate for the office of Department Guard. Yes, after being elected to that position, I told my two mentors that it was watching them, and learning from them that inspired me to be a more active member. So, I encourage each of you to be the best member you can possible be, because you never know who is watching you. You could be leading by example and not know that your actions are an inspiration to another member. If someone asks for your assistance, make yourself available. It may seem like a simple question to you, but to the person asking, it is important. If you don’t know the answer, do some research. In fact, do the research together with the person who asked the question. Turn it into a learning experience. Your mentee may someday become the mentor!

Reporting your mentoring activities: I hear you groaning! I just recently took a look at the Department’s reporting system, and I have to tell you, I was disappointed. I hear (all the time), “I don’t do these things for a pat on the back, or an award.” I know that, and you are not alone. Let me give you a couple of good reasons to report your work. 1) It will help preserve your not-for-profit status. 2) The National Commander in Chief addresses Congress each year and your hours, miles, and dollars spent, combined with those figures from other Auxiliaries across the country speak volumes when presented to your elected representatives. So, make your voice heard when it comes to promoting issues that are important to veterans. In the Department’s reporting system, you will start off with a few yes/no questions, and a few simple answer questions like the year, month, Auxiliary Number and District Number. Even if you answer no to some of the questions, don’t let that deter you. Go to the section where you have an opportunity to describe your work in detail. One of the questions in the Mentoring for Leadership reporting system is, “Did any member step up to mentor another member?” That one is a Y/N answer. Go to item 9 and give details. If your Auxiliary sponsored a training session, you can report that as mentoring. Be sure to include how many members attended the session, and how many members acted as trainers. You can also include details about what was taught, how much time was spent planning and carrying out the session. Some Auxiliaries have developed a form for members to complete each month describing their work on programs. Some have appointed one person in the Auxiliary to be responsible for entering the information into the Department’s reporting system. They say it simplifies things and prevents duplication of entries. Hopefully, you will check out the reporting system and find that it is not so difficult to use. Please report your work!
