February is supposed to be the month of love. Why does it have to be just one month? Let's show our love for each other and especially our Veterans every day. I love and appreciate each of you for all of your hard work and dedication.

CONGRATULATIONS to Cheryl Jones and Auxiliary 1706 Lincolnton for being the first Auxiliary to submit new member applications on the new form, properly completed. Great job, Cheryl. And to LeeAnn Bisesi of Auxiliary 7315 Havelock for submitting the first credit card application. The member responded to the link immediately and was shown in her Auxiliary roster in less than 24 hours!!! This is the way it needs to be done.

Also, **CONGRATULATIONS** to Auxiliary 2615 in Goldsboro for being the first Auxiliary to return all of their Department fundraiser raffle tickets and money. Thank you so much.

We have been talking quite a lot about the new applications, the processing procedures and payment. What we haven't discussed is yet another new way to pay dues. Dues can now be paid ON THE PHONE! Yep. I said it. Pay the dues by phone. For those who do not have a MALTA account (but everyone should), there is a phone number to call in and pay the annual dues over the phone by credit or debit card. National is doing everything possible to make it easier for every member to pay their dues in a timelier manner. There really is no excuse for not getting your dues paid. **Simply dial 866-299-1286 and follow the prompts for this new, safe, easy way to pay.**

This information comes straight from National. "If you have not yet paid your dues, you are not a member in good standing. If you are not a member in good standing, you cannot attend meetings, hold office or vote. But do not fear - this is fixable! All you have to do is pay your dues ASAP and we offer a number of ways to do so. (Keep in mind, if you still have not paid by June 30, you will lose your membership and have to rejoin, which means re-applying, being voted in again and restarting your years of continuing membership, which impacts your ability to apply for a Continuing Education Scholarship, to receive a Cancer Grant and to be invited to the 45+year members celebration at National Convention.)"

Reminders for this month:

- The audits for the quarter ending 12.31.25 are due no later than 2.28.26
- All District audits are due within 30 days of your meeting, which means I should have all District audits no later than 2.25.26
- If your Auxiliary has not made your annual contributions, please do that now.
- If your Auxiliary has not paid your District dues, please send these to your **DISTRICT TREASURER** immediately. These must be paid before the Spring District conventions for your Auxiliary to participate in the elections. Your Auxiliary must be in good standing to participate in voting and elections.

FEBRUARY NOTES

With most of the District Meetings behind us, I hope everyone is preparing for the National President's visit February 25 – 27. I'll include the flyer with this mail, and send it out a few more times in a Bulletin Board. Don't forget to share it with your VFW members as they are welcome to attend this event with us.

I want to talk about some of the feedback I'm getting about the Bulletin Board messages. Almost all of the comments are positive. Everyone seems to like to get reminders and notifications between editions of the monthly mail.

♦ One complaint is that some people are not getting the monthly mail or the Bulletin Boards. I can think of a couple of reasons why that could be the case. **1)** The information in MALTA is not correct. I got all of the email addresses from MALTA. It is each member's responsibility to update their profile information in MALTA. If a member's office changes, the Auxiliary Secretary is supposed to send a Change of Officer Form to me. **2)** Not all members are included in the email group. It is the responsibility of the President or Secretary to see to it that they have a method of sharing the Monthly Mail and Bulletin Boards with ALL of their members. Establishing an email group consisting of as many of your members as possible is a good start. An old fashioned phone tree would be an alternate way to contact members without email addresses.

♦ Another complaint is that some people are not happy about getting a message that says, "I got it" because someone clicked on **RESPOND ALL** to let me know they got their mail. If you want to let me know that you received a message from me, that is OK; although not necessary. Just click on the left pointing arrow at the top of the message and your response will only come to me. When you click on the kebab (3 vertical dots) it causes a dropdown menu allowing you to respond, respond all, forward, delete, etc. So, accessing the dropdown menu requires more keystrokes than just clicking on the left pointing arrow if you only want to respond to me. **Please DO NOT click on RESPOND ALL unless it is something you really want to share with over 200 members.**

Normally, there are 2 stations set up: one in the main lobby and one at the patient entrance. If you are willing to send a couple of members to help with this, please let me know as soon as possible. I need to let the VA know if we need more than one table, more than one chair, and how much coffee we will need.

If your Auxiliary would like to provide gift/goodie bags for the veterans during this week, these are always appreciated. Goodie bags with small Valentine cards, sugar-free candies and gum (no Hard candy, please, as this can be a choking hazard), ChapStick are always a big hit with the veterans. If you would like to just sign a bunch of Valentine Cards, or work with a school to have students sign the cards, the cards will be placed on the meal trays for the Veterans who are currently patients at the VA. These always bring a smile to their faces.

Please do not forget about the P.A.R.C unit on the 9th floor. These veterans get very few visitors. And they enjoy everything that is provided for them. Ice cream socials, Provided by gift cards, Bingo games, which only take 2-3 members, and small gifts as prizes. These veterans get very little stimulation and are offered very few activities, which is so important in their continued care.

January? Or did we have another Government Shutdown?

Amplify the VFW's message to "Honor the Contract"

The VFW Auxiliary plays a vital role in supporting the VFW's legislative priorities. While the VFW leads national advocacy efforts, the Auxiliary serves as the Informed Amplifier, the trusted messenger who expands reach and helps energize communities to take action. As real-time legislative toolkits are released, and we prepare for the Washington, D.C. Legislative Conference, each Auxiliary must understand how to communicate effectively and express gratitude while amplifying the VFW's message to "Honor the Contract."

The Auxiliaries role as the Informed Amplifier

The Auxiliary is not simply a messenger, it is an Informed Amplifier, meaning:

- *We Amplify ONLY what is accurate and approved.*
- *Share messaging exactly as provided by the VFW Washington office.*
- *Do not rewrite, interpret or summarize the bill in your own words.*
- *Maintain the approved tone and position.*
- *Help members understand how their voice contributes to the legislative process.*
- *The Auxiliary reaches people the VFW may not, like families, caregivers, educators, youth and community partners.*
- *Amplification is not just about volume, it's about heart. Your voice can add emotion and connection to personal stories that highlight why these issues matter to veterans' families.*
- *The Auxiliary can also add a tone of appreciation and respect that strengthens relationships with lawmakers and communities.*

Show of Gratitude

Each Auxiliary is encouraged to prepare its own expression of gratitude to accompany legislative efforts. Ideas include:

- *Posting a thank-you message to lawmakers who support veteran issues.*
- *Sharing a spotlight story from a veteran or family connected to the legislation and thank a legislator that is actively supporting that piece of legislation.*
- *Sending handwritten or digital thank-you notes to Congressional offices.*

This gratitude-forward approach strengthens relationships and reinforces the Auxiliary's unique voice in legislative advocacy.

Remember!! Report your Election activities in MALTA! That includes voting, working the polls, working as a greeter, attending Candidate Forums and Candidate events.

- **How to Look Up a Bill on Congress.gov** (Tip: Bookmark the page so you can check back on progress anytime!)
- **Go to www.congress.gov.** In the search bar, type the bill number or a keyword. Click on the bill title in the results list.
- **Review details:** Bill text and summary; Sponsor, co-sponsors and committees assigned.
- **Status (Introduced, In Committee, Passed House/Senate, etc.)**
- **Use this info in your advocacy.** Cite the bill by number in your letters and calls. Connect your personal story to the bill's purpose.
- **Share updates with your Auxiliary.**

Hello sisters and brothers of the Auxiliary. Let's talk about the VFW Pre-Discharge program and how it provides information for separating and retiring service members with expert assistance in filing for their VA benefits while they are still on active duty. Eligible service members can begin the process up to 180 days before discharge, which helps ensure a smoother transition into civilian life. VFW Pre-Discharge representatives—located on or near major military installations—guide service members through preparing and submitting claims, including disability compensation, education benefits, healthcare enrollment, and more.

This program often works hand-in-hand with the VA's Benefits Delivery at Discharge (BDD) initiative, which is designed to speed up claims decisions for those who file before leaving active duty. All services provided by VFW representatives are offered at no cost, helping service members avoid predatory "claim sharks" and ensuring they receive the benefits they have earned.
