A Message from the Department Treasurer March 2025 Vfwauxnc.org



Brothers and Sisters,

Treasurers, when you enter dues into MALTA, you are provided a receipt showing you how much will be deducted from your Auxiliary checking account (\$18 per member you enter, \$10 for National, \$8 for the Department.) You should be printing this receipt each time for your accounting records, as well as recording the dues you have submitted. Then, when you receive the email from National informing you of the actual withdrawal, you should go into you MALTA account, go under duties and print the receipt from "Withdrawals from National". Once the withdrawal has been made, and you have deducted the amount from your Auxiliary checkbook, you should attach the receipt from the posting of the dues with the withdrawal notice. This is important for accurate record keeping. And to assist with your audits. The same should be done when you get a notification from National when a deposit is made in your account, such as the recent Life Member Payout that was received in January or any awards you may receive. This should be treated as the same as deposit receipts you receive from your bank when you make a deposit and should be checked by the trustees.

No one should be holding money belonging to an Auxiliary or District. If you have money in your possession it should be turned over immediately to the treasurer to be deposited. Treasurers deposit the money immediately. It is also recommended that you get a receipt for any monies you turn over. This is simply for record keeping purposes. Additionally, if a member owes the Auxiliary/District money and the Auxiliary/District owes the same member money for a reimbursement, that money cannot be taken out of what the member owes. These must be shown as separate transactions in your records to have an accurate paper trail of the deposits/repayment and the reimbursement. Remember all reimbursements must be accompanied by a clear receipt, signed by the trustees and have been voted on by motion of the Auxiliary before it can be made.

Remember, in April you will begin voting on your Delegates for the District, Department and National Conventions. Please be sure to use the forms found on the Department website when submitting your District and Department delegates. The Department of North Carolina allows for 1 delegate and 1 alternate for every 10 members or fraction thereof. This is different from the first part of the Bylaws section on delegates, as the second part states unless your Department Bylaws allows differently. Every Auxiliary, regardless of whether a member will be attending the Department Convention or not, is required to submit the delegate list and fees no later than 25 May. You may want to elect your District Delegates at your March meeting, as the District meetings will begin in April. The list of your delegates needs to be sent to your District Secretary prior to the meeting. However, always take a copy with you to the meeting as a back-up.

I should have received all the 31 December audits by this time. If I have not, you need to get this to me immediately, as they were due by 28 February. Any Auxiliary delinquent in their Audits cannot participate in the voting at their District Conventions.

The Department fundraiser tickets were distributed to District Presidents and the C of A. They will deliver them to each Auxiliary. Every Auxiliary is expected to participate in this important fundraiser to help with the expenses of the Department. These include the Program awards given each year, our expenses for each of the Department meetings among others. Please make sure the ticket stubs are fully completed to ensure the winners receive their checks. All stubs and monies need to be to be returned to me no later than 25 May.



- * If you have an **Auxiliary member who has accumulated a total of 150 hours** or more as a Hospital Volunteer, be sure to let me know:
- ~ their name
- ~ name of the medical facility where the hours were accumulated
- ~ name of the Voluntary Service Program Manager, Supervisor or Chief Nurse of VA Hospital or non-VA Hospital who will sign the application of verification.
- * If you have a **Sponsored Hospital Volunteer/student who has volunteered under VFW Auxiliary in any VA Hospital or non-VA facility with 100 hours** or more is eligible to receive a pin. I will need the above information for verification.

It's hard to believe it's March and *Hospital Applications for Awards* are due to me by March 31, 2025. Plan ahead, think and share the wonderful things you have done for our Veterans!


