Brothers and Sisters,

- ➤ IMPORTANT NOTICE! The Department contribution form has been updated to reflect donations to the Department President's Love give should now be made payable to the Department VFWA and sent directly to me, as the Department treasurer. All previous donations sent to Anna Holm have been submitted to the Department. We greatly appreciate Anna offering to take on this task.
- ANNUAL MEMBER DUES ARE \$13. IF ANY AMOUNT OTHER THAN THIS IS SENT WITH AN APPLICATION, IT WILL BE RETURNED!
- It was great to see so many of you at the Council of Administration meeting in Greensboro. I hope those of you that attended the training classes on Friday afternoon learned a few new things, had some things clarified for you and that any questions you may have had were answered. If you have any additional questions, please, as always, reach out to me or the other officers to get the answers you need.
- Pofficers AT ALL LEVELS: Pay your dues NOW!! Do not wait until December to pay your annual dues. Remember, National will automatically remove you from office if your dues are not paid by 31 December. You will NOT automatically be reinstated to your office just because you pay your dues after you are removed from office. Don't wait until the last minute. Take care of this important responsibility now. All annual members must have their dues paid prior to 31 December to remain a member in good standing. If you have annual members that have not yet paid their dues, please reach out to them personally. Per section 810 of the Bylaws, the Auxiliary President 'Shall appoint a committee of not less than 5 members, including the treasurer, to contact all members during the year for payment of dues". (Any monies collected must be turned over immediately to the treasurer.) Give the members a call. Check in on them. Not only will they appreciate hearing from you, but you may find there is a reason (hardship, illness, etc.) as to why they haven't paid their dues.
- THE AUDITS FOR THE PERIOD ENDING 09/30/2023 ARE DUE TO ME NO LATER THAN 11/30/2023. Please make sure you are using the correct audit form (which can be found on the Department website). Audits may be completed with a minimum of a least one of your elected trustees and one pro-tem trustee appointed by the President. All District audits from the meetings should be in to me by now.
- All treasurers should have a form 8822-B IRS Change of responsibility form on file with the IRS. If you are a new treasurer, you were reminded to submit this form earlier this year. Existing treasurers, it might be a good idea to submit an updated one to assure the information on file with the IRS is current. This form can be found on the Department website under Resources: "Treasurer Information".
- At the C of A, I talked about the Department Grant/Guarantee program. This refers to the address labels, calendars, and other mailings you receive from National. When you send in a donation for these items, it is supporting our Department. We receive a percentage of the donations you make to National. So, on behalf of the Department, I would like to thank each of you for your participation in this program. I am including the information on a separate sheet for those that might be interested in signing up.

BORN IN A BAR.....THE US MARINE CORPS The year is 1775, the day Nov. 10, Men of different ages and occupations gathered in a dusty, candle-lit bar to listen as two individuals offered them a chance to be the first of a new breed fighting for independence. A breed that would be known as the United States Marines. As the men prepare to answer this call to arms, more join them within the walls of this place, known as TUN TAVERN. Located in Philadelphia, Penn., this establishment played an integral role in not just the birth of the Marine Corps, but the early days of the United States. In 1781, Tun Tavern burned down. Interstate 95 now runs through the original location. Today, a commemorative marker stands on the street where Tun Tavern once stood, denoting its immortal place as the birthplace of the United States Marine Corps.

Veterans Day (originally known as Armistice Day) is a federal holiday in the United States observed annually on November 11, for honoring military Veterans of the United States Armed Forces (who were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable). It coincides with other holidays including Armistice Day and Remembrance Day which are commemorated in other countries that mark the anniversary of the end of World War I. Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. At the urging of major U.S. Veteran organizations, Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day in 1954. Legally, two minutes of silence is recommended to be observed at 2:11pm Eastern Standard Time. This Veterans Day, take 2 minutes out of your schedule for a moment of silence, in honor of all Veterans...And don't forget to wear your Buddy Poppy today.



Feel free to send a reporter or editor a personal email and be sure to include your contact information.

What's newsworthy?

Consider these questions: Does it involve local people? Does it interest non-members? Is it timely? Does it help the community? Is it unique and new? If the answer is yes, this is a chance for you to pitch a story with an "angle" that will showcase your Auxiliary's hard work and accomplishments. Let's show our communities, and our nation, everything we do to improve the lives of veterans, service members and their families.

LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM—NOVEMBER 2023







ON CAPITAL HILL—And the new Speaker of the House is?

Recently, Speaker of the House Kevin McCarthy was ousted from the seat, and *apparently* without a good plan for going forward. As of this writing (Oct. 20th), Representative Jim Jordan has lost a 3rd vote to become Speaker. The Republicans in the House voted by secret ballot to remove Jordan as their Speaker Nominee. Our own NC Congressional Rep, Patrick McHenry is Speaker Pro Tem and *MAY* act as interim until January.

With so much chaos in the world, we need to tell our representative to get back to work for our Veterans, our Miliary and our Country.

Korean American VALOR Act To amend title 38, United States Code, to treat certain individuals who served in Vietnam as a member of the armed forces of the Republic of Korea as a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States for purposes of the provision of health care by the Department of Veterans Affairs. This bill passed Congress on October 19, 2023 and goes to the President next.

Report on Military Barracks Released: The Government Accountability Office (GAO) released a report on its review of military barracks. The study, which was required as part of the *National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2022*, found mold and raw sewage among other health, safety, and well-being concerns. GAO also found that DOD lacks reliable mechanisms to track barracks conditions and the funding spent on improvements. This report bolsters the need to pass VFW-supported H.R. 3165, *Military Housing Transparency and Accountability Act*. Read the report.

REMINDER, OCTOBER CHALLENGE! NC MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS OCTOBER THROUGH NOVEMEMBER 7TH

Some of you (like Pasquotank County and others) have had your municipal elections on October 10th. But more will have theirs on November 7th. If you haven't voted, DO IT!!! This is when voters choose who will represent them in local government offices, such as mayor and councilperson. *CHALLENGE* is to be among the top 3 Reports on Election Activities through November 8th. **PRIZES!!! But you must report!**

2024 ELECTIONS ARE COMING! Filing for statewide primary races begins Dec. 4th and ends Dec. 15th. There are 4 types of people who work during one stop voting an on Election Day during our primaries and general election. Poll Judges and Assistant Judges are paid workers inside the polling place; Poll workers help in setting up sites, logging in voters and assisting judges (also paid); Poll Observers watch the voting procedure to make sure that rules are followed (not paid, training required) and Electioneers who interact with voters passing out literature on the candidates (volunteers). Will you step up to keep our elections free and fair?

What is a mentee? I like to think of a mentee as a *mentor in training*. So, if you look at it the same way I do, a mentor is not just someone who is showing or teaching you how to do a particular thing, it is someone who is teaching you to become the mentor – the person who will at some point, take their place. I'm sure you have heard people say, that reminds me of your mother, or that reminds me of something my mother used to say to me. Yes, your mother was a mentor. She was teaching you how to take her place, or at least not be so dependent upon her. That may seem like a simplistic way to describe it, but it gets the point across. I hear people say, I can't be a mentor, and I think to myself, yes, you can! You can be a mentor even without trying. How? You might ask. Maybe you've heard the old expression, "actions speak louder than words." When someone is kind, their action is much more effective than merely saying, be kind.
