A Message from the Department Treasurer November 2024 Vfwauxnc.org



Brothers and Sisters,

The first reminder this month is regarding your audit for the quarter ending 30 September 2024. This audit is due to me no later than 30 November 2024. Remember, per the Bylaws, the Trustees are to perform the actual audit. Not just sign off on what is presented to them by the treasurer. The trustees should also be auditing the minutes of the Secretary. The President, Secretary and treasurer should be present for the audit. Please use the audit form provided to you previously in the Department mail and on the Department website.

Please remember that now everyone has completed the audit ending 6.30.34, a copy of this financial statement should be given to your Post Commander, per the Bylaws.

Application reminders for this month:

- ✓ Abbreviations of Street names are not allowed. The words Street, Road, Lane, etc. can be abbreviated. The actual name of the street cannot.
- ✓ City names cannot be abbreviated. Southern Pines cannot be So. Pines, Elizabeth City cannot be Eliz. City., Fayetteville cannot be Fay., etc. The full spelling of the city must be put on the application.
- ✓ On the application line:" **Relationship** _______ **to the Veteran** ______," this is the relationship of the applicant to the veteran under which they are joining. Meaning they are the wife, husband, son, daughter, etc to the veteran. Not that the veteran is their father, mother, grandfather, etc. Please look at this carefully before sending the applications.
- Please make sure you include your Auxiliary number, city and state on all applications and transfers.
- ✓ And once again remember, I am not supposed to make any changes to an application. This is from National. My handwriting should not appear on any application except where I write the membership number and date. Errors and omissions on applications will delay the processing if the applications have to be returned to the Auxiliary.

Contributions/donations need to be accompanied by a contribution form, which can be found on the Department website. <u>All donations</u> to the Erline Mayberry Scholarship must be sent in a separate check from other donations.

It was voted by the Council to once again conduct the Department fundraiser raffle. These tickets will be distributed to the District Presidents at the Council of Administration meeting in February, to be given to Auxiliaries.. This is the largest fundraiser for the Department to raise the necessary funds to run the Department. Every Auxiliary is expected to support the Department and sell the tickets they receive.

At the recent Council of Administration meeting, I was informed by another Department officer that many of you had contacted her telling her you no longer wanted to work with me. I am sorry to hear this. And, unfortunately, as long as I am elected as your Department treasurer, we will have to find a way to work together. If there is an issue with anything I have said or done, please contact me directly so we can address it together. Talking to me is the only way to truly get it resolved, not to another officer. I am doing the best I can to mentor the members, especially the treasurers and trustees in the correct way to handle their responsibilities according to the National Bylaws and directions I get from my leaders at National. These are not my rules, regulations and requirements. I have said since first being elected as Department Treasurer that I am available to anyone that needs assistance or guidance. I have tried to do the best I can. And I feel I am pretty approachable. At least, I hope so. So, if you have a problem with me or how I am trying to guide you, please reach out to me and let's have a conversation.



The CDCE (Center for Development and Civic Engagement) coordinates holiday programs are designed to provide in-kind gifts to assist Veteran patients who are in crisis resulting from medical issues, unemployment, homelessness, or other difficult circumstances. This month I am going to talk about the Veteran Holiday Tree Program.

To participate in this program, the Social workers Case managers and Recreation therapists will submit a wish list on behalf of the Veteran to list specific gift suggestions and gifts requested by the Veteran Patient. The CDCE staff will hang the Wishlist on the Holiday tree in their office and will provide the number of Veterans requesting gifts to the VSO/VAVS reps They ask the gifts be valued at a minimum of \$25. (When the information is sent to me, I will share this with each of the Auxiliaries who work with the Durham VA.

The role of the sponsor for this program will be to contact Kendra Mondren (919-286-0411 x177810 or Kendra.Mondren@VA.gov and let her know how many individuals your Auxiliary would like to sponsor, no later than 2 December 2024. They are asking for the gifts be wrapped, labeled and delivered to the CDCE office no later than 14 December 2024. In the event you experience difficulties with providing the gifts please notify the CDCE office no later than 16 December 2024. Your assistance with this will be greatly appreciated by the Veterans you assist.

Don't forget you still have time to donate to the Thanksgiving food bag drive as I mentioned last month. All donations must be received by the CDCE office no later than 21 November 2024.

LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM—NOVEMBER 2024

From Our Roots to Our Branches, Extend Service to Our Veterans. NOVEMBER 11TH IS VETERAN'S DAY HONORING ALL WHO SERVED!



I am very thankful for all the VFWs and VFW Auxiliaries that have come to the aid of our Western North Carolina! I hope you have been following our Facebook page where I have posted news about voting locations and hours in Western NC! See the results of the election. Now that the Election is (almost) behind us, let's keep up the good work and continue to be Advocates in Action...

For starters, keep working on the basics:

- Keep studying the VFW Legislative Priority Goals.
- Keep reading the VFW Action Corps Weekly.
- Keep current on pending legislation, both state and federal.
- Keep responding to the VFW Action Alerts.
- Keep visiting the VFW Legislative Resource webpage: https://www.vfw.org/advocacy/national-legislative-service

Next, apply the knowledge you gained from these basics to your advocacy efforts at the local level. Explain how the **PRIORITY GOALS** serve as a blueprint for protecting our veterans' rights. Then **show them** how pending legislation relates to this blueprint and whether you want them to support that bill.

Ways to reach out to our local leaders: Write letters, make phone calls and send emails. Invite them to you post for special events or patriotic celebrations. You and your members can speak to them personally.

Remember that Auxiliaries must remain nonpartisan! If you are seeking support to pass upcoming legislation or for a special project, you can invite your current representative, regardless of party. But when hosting events for election purposes, *you should invite candidates from all the parties*. Collaborate with your VFW Post when possible.

Keep our momentum going! Reach out to newly elected officials and introduce yourself. Keep in contact with current representatives. Know where they stand on veterans' rights and issues and then let our voices be heard!

Enacted after being signed by the President: S. 2825: Dustoff Crews of the Vietnam War Congressional Gold Medal Act--A bill to award a Congressional Gold Medal to the United States Army Dustoff crews of the Vietnam War and S. 656: Veteran Improvement Commercial Driver License Act of 2023--A bill to revise the rules for approval by the Secretary of VA of commercial driver education programs for veterans.

Sent to the President: H.R. 7777: Veterans' Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act of 2024--To increase, the rates of compensation for veterans with service-connected disabilities and the rates of dependency and indemnity compensation for the survivors of certain disabled veterans.
