A Message from the Department Treasurer September 2024 Vfwauxnc.org

Brothers and Sisters,

I have quite a bit of information to share with you this month. Including a couple of updates from the National Convention.

I am still getting applications with missing information. Recruiters, investigating committee members (especially as this is your responsibility) and treasurers should be checking and double-checking every application to ensure all of the required information is provided, Any missing information requires I return the application to the Auxiliary to complete the application. I am not supposed to make any changes to an application. Example: I recently sent an application to National for processing. It was a life app being paid for by credit card. All the information was on the application except the applicant did not mark MALE or FEMALE. It was obvious the applicant was a male. His name was Jr., he was listed as the son of the veteran. National returned the application because that was not marked. I sent this to National knowing it would be returned, but I did this so I would I have the "proof" that we are not to make changes to applications. If National won't make this small correction, neither will I. Please understand, when I return these applications, I am not trying to be difficult. When Department treasurers are trained by National, and I have attended several, we are instructed that we are not to make any changes to an application. The same way National will return an application, I am supposed to the same. Once the applicant has signed the application, it becomes a legal document and I do not have the right or authority to change or alter the application without the permission of the applicant. Applicants DO NOT answer my calls or return my messages. Additionally, by not returning the application to the Auxiliary for the necessary corrections, I am failing in my duty to properly train and mentor you. Also, and this is a biggie. The applications must be legible. If I can't read the information provided, I can't enter it into the system. If you have a hard time reading, you can bet I will. Take the information, type a new application and have them sign it.

All contributions must be accompanied with a contribution form. I cannot ask this enough. I am still getting checks with just a memo in the memo line or a note written. Make sure your Auxiliary number is included on the contribution form as well as your check. Also, please make sure the memo on your check matches what is on your contribution form. If they do not match, technically I have to go with what is on the check because that is your "legal" proof of where the money was intended.

When submitting your 990 form, please make sure your Auxiliary number is on there. If you notice, it is not automatically provided by the IRS. If you mail it to me, simply write it on the form. If you email it, make sure you put your Auxiliary number in the email so I can write it on the form when I print it. Speaking of your 990, you should be filing that this month.

One of the resolutions passed at the National Convention dealt with audits. It clarifies that the audits are to be completed by the trustees-only. A minimum of 2 trustees are required to perform the audit, with at least one being an elected trustee. It is preferred that the elected trustees perform the audit. The President, secretary and treasurer should attend the audit, but **CANNOT** perform the audit. The audit must be completed and signed by the trustees. The Auxiliary MUST vote to accept the audit and THEN forward a copy to the Department treasurer. The audit form provided in the August mail and on the Department website have a line to indicate when the audit was presented to the Auxiliary. This information must be provided. So please use the form you have been given.

Also, at National it was voted that Districts may now increase their District dues to an amount not to exceed \$1.00. The previous amount was \$.50. To increase the dues in your District will require a vote of your membership.



Another resolution from National now gives treasurers permission to secure their records in a typed, computer-generated ledger in a permanent record book, inserted in a three-ring binder, or a clip folder.

As always, I am just a phone call or email away if there is anything I can assist you with.

Hello brother and sisters, as some of you may already know, the month of September is suicide prevention month. Not only is it to prevent suicide but to remember those that may have committed suicide. Also, to remember those family members that are still struggling with the lost of a loved one. If you know a Veteran or family member who's struggling, don't wait for their problems to become overwhelming. Reach out today to get the support they need. The Veterans Crisis Line is available 24/7. **Dial 988 then press 1**. It is

confidential crisis support line for Veterans and their loved ones as well as civilians. There are different types of warning signs you may see for yourself or another person who may be in crisis. All warning signs require attention, and some require immediate action. Some people will make jokes about suicide when they are having suicidal thoughts. Not everyone who makes a suicide attempt shows warning signs. However, warning signs of suicide should always be taken seriously, even if the person seems to be joking. Members, if you need someone to speak at your meeting, do not hesitate to reach out to a suicide counselor, at any VA clinic to learn the warning signs.





"Americanism is an unfailing love of country; loyalty to its institutions and ideas; eagerness to defend it against all enemies; undivided allegiance to the flag; and a desire to secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and posterity."

Patriotic Instruction

Displaying the Flag On same staff US Flag at peak, above any other flag.

Grouped

US Flag goes to its own right. Flags of other nations are flown at same height.

Marching

US Flag to marchers right (observer's left).

On Speaker's Platform

When displayed with the speaker's platform, it must be above and behind the speaker. If mounted on a staff, it is on the speaker's right.

Illumination Guidelines

Per Federal Flag Code, Section 2, it is the universal custom to display the flag only from sunrise to sunset on buildings and stationary flagstaffs in the open. However, when a patriotic effect is desired, the flag may be displayed 24 hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness. Promote Patriotism by Celebrating Patriotic Holidays

How to establish a Facebook page:

- Once you have access to your MALTA account, click on Member Resources located on the dashboard at the top of the page.
- Scroll down and select Historian & Media Relations.
- Click on How to Set Up Your Auxiliary Facebook Page to locate detailed instructions.
- Follow the step-by-step process and helpful tips to create your Facebook page.

Additional assistance for managing your Auxiliary Facebook page is also included in the Historian & Media Relations resources.

Tips for a successful Facebook page:

- Your Facebook page should be kept up to date with fresh ideas to encourage members to follow the page and to check in often.
- Invite your members to join your Auxiliary Facebook page.
- LIKE & SHARE! This is how news spreads.
- Only Auxiliary business is appropriate. Politics and personal information should be omitted.
- Post photos, videos, blogs, or vlogs to let everyone know what your Auxiliary is doing.
- Share Programs with your members and the community while also providing options for participation.
- Include a link to your auxiliary website to highlight even more details about our organization, events, Programs, and ways the community can support Veterans.

Use online resources for inspiration and access established Auxiliary Facebook pages to see how others promote the ways we support Veterans, service members, their families, and our communities.

Needing to apply for Aid and Attendance or Housebound Benefits?

VA financial benefits for Housebound and Aid and Attendance are managed by the Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA). To understand your eligibility and to receive assistance with your claim, we strongly recommend that you contact your local Veterans Service Organization (VSO), or the Veterans Benefits Administration (1-800-827-1000), or visit this website: https://www.va.gov/pension/aid-attendance-housebound/.

Veterans receiving a VA Pension or whose Service-Connected conditions are directly related to the need for benefits may be eligible to apply for **Housebound** or **Aid and Attendance Benefits.**

- You may qualify for the "Housebound" benefit if you do not have the ability to freely and safely leave your house because of a permanent disability.
- You may qualify for the "Aid and Attendance" (A&A) benefit if you consistently need the assistance of another person with activities of daily living, which may include feeding, going to bathroom, bathing, dressing, walking, etc.

The completed VA Form 21-2680 (Version Feb 2023), **EXAMINATION FOR HOUSEBOUND STATUS OR PERMANENT NEED FOR REGULAR AID AND ATTENDANCE** is required for your application. Obtain **VA Form 21-2680** from your Veterans Service Officer or at www.va.gov/find-forms/

Get Connected to Affordable Internet

Do you receive a <u>VA pension</u>? If so, VA and the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) are making it easier for you to connect to the internet. Qualifying VA pension recipients may be eligible to participate in either FCC's Lifeline or Affordable Connectivity Programs to access discounted internet and phone services.

ALERT—ALERT—THE 2024 ELECTION IS HERE! Absentee Ballots begin mailing out on Sept. 6th and Early Voting Begins on October 17th!

The online Judicial Voter Guide: 2024 General Election is now available on the State Board of Elections' website. The digital guide contains information about 2024 candidates for North Carolina's appellate courts – the North Carolina Supreme Court and North Carolina Court of Appeals. The general election is November 5, 2024. Candidates for appellate offices are elected statewide. Candidates for other judicial offices are not elected statewide and are not included in this guide. Ballots for all N.C. voters in 2024 will include four appellate court contests: N.C. Supreme Court Associate Justice Seat 6, and N.C. Court of Appeals Judge Seats 12, 14, and 15. For more information about the general election, go to Upcoming Election.

<u>Voter Search</u>: Search for voter details, including jurisdictions, polling place, sample ballot when available, absentee ballot information, and voter history.

DON'T FORGET THE CHALLENGE! In August, I challenged you and your Auxiliaries (and/or in conjunction with your Post) to host Candidate Forums or Town Halls. This of course counts in your reporting. Attend any forums or activities that the candidates may be speaking or appearing. Meet them, ask tough questions. **LET THESE CANDIDATES KNOW WE CARE ABOUT VETERAN AND MILITARY ISSUES AND WE VOTE!**

ADVOCATE! Congress returns after Labor Day (mostly—they will still campaign). The 118th Congress will end at the end of the year, and the 119th will be seated in January. Bills die, and then we start over! Please continue to contact our Senators and Representatives on these and other issues:

- Afghan Allies Amendment! The amendment is based on S. 2327, the Afghan Adjustment Act.
- S. 4677: Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2025
- Major Richard Star Act (S. 344) as an amendment to the FY 2025 NDAA via a floor vote in the coming weeks.
- H.R. 542: Elizabeth Dole Home Care Act of 2023: This bill passed in the House on December 5, 2023, and was sent to the Senate. Contact our Senators and urge them to pass this bill!
- **S. 815:** Hello Girls Congressional Gold Medal Act of 2023: A bill to award a Congressional Gold Medal to the female telephone operators of the Army Signal Corps, known as the "Hello Girls".
